7) Officer Summary/Report Out – NOT ADDRESSED IN DETAIL DUE TO TIME CONSTRAINTS

- Division Chair (Gregg Warnick) attending virtually
 - Led monthly division executive meetings and communicated regularly with executive officers
 - ii) Championed effort to create best paper process for division
 - iii) Led effort to create new division executive officer positions and update division bylaws
 - (1) Awards Committee Chair
 - (2) Program Co-Chair/Program Chair Elect
- Program Chair/Chair Elect (David Nino)
 - i) 28 abstracts submitted; 2 rejected; 11 final papers published
 - ii) Recruited small group to plan the conference (Dena Lang, Seth Sullivan, Ed Kirtley, Lori Houghtalen). This new structure has lots of benefits, including providing a deeper pool of people with direct experience in conference programming.
 - iii) Experimented with three tiers of "tracks" for paper submissions (research, applied, work-in-progress).
 - iv) Recruited several new reviewers enough so that each paper had at least three reviewers. We ended up with more reviewers than papers to review.
 - v) Sent guidelines and suggestions to all reviewers on how to evaluate and give feedback.
 - vi) Did research behind how to create and implement forms of "Reviewer Recognition". We will likely implement these ideas next year.

- Director of Scholarly Activity (Bill Schell) not attending other ASEE commitments
 - i) Used the momentum of the improved review process in the 2018 ASEE conference to expand the visibility of LEAD author work in the engineering education community.
 - (1) Primary outcome of this was recruitment of LEAD related papers for the Frontiers in Education Conference and coordination with that conferences review process.
 - (2) FIE was held in San Jose in October and featured four engineering leadership related papers and a workshop led by our members.
- Outreach Liaison (Mike Erdman) not attending due to other commitment
 - i) The focus this past year has been on maintaining the contact with COMPLETE, while developing formats for encouraging the spread of engineering leadership development programs around the country. The initial drive has been on engaging the Big Ten plus schools.

- ii) With the help of John Park, Andrea Ragonese, David Nino and Dena Lang, we have organized a Rapid-Fire round-table event for this Annual Meeting, with 7 participating university engineering leadership programs. We hope that this format will be continued in the future with a focus on other groupings of universities with leadership programs
- iii) John Park and Adam Goodman, with a little support from Mike Erdman have taken the lead to develop a B1G+ Conference of Engineering Leadership Programs to be held in Chicago in the fall. Details will be forwarded as this takes shape. Once again, we are hopeful that this process can be continued into the future, both with annual meetings of the B1G+ programs and initial meetings of other groupings of universities.
- iv) Outreach Liaison, Mike Erdman, will be retiring on 31 December from his position as Walter L. Robb Director of Engineering Leadership Development at Penn State. As such, the position of Outreach Chair will be open. Interested LEAD members should contact Gregg Warnick.
